Cutting Edge: Next Generation Technology and Trial Tactics

Successful Defense of Negligent Security Cases

The Changing Landscape in Defending Professional Negligence Claims

The defense of professional negligence claims is changing in significant ways as a result of recent case law and statutes. As we all know, medical malpractice premiums came to another cycle of extraordinary highs in the late 1990's to early 2000's. Many states passed various tort reforms to address the issue, such as requiring plaintiffs to obtain a certificate of merit from an expert. The United States Supreme Court, however, has recently held that such a requirement under Delaware law to file an affidavit of merit along with the complaint shall not apply to medical malpractice cases in federal court. This panel will review current standards, and how best to analyze how they may impact your claims.

E-I-AI-O! Artificial Intelligence in Claims and Litigation

Throughout history, many General Purpose Technologies (GPTs) have fundamentally transformed the way we live and work. Think about steam power, computers, the internet, or smartphones.
